Goodbye Equivalency Route

CERTIFICATION CHAIR UPDATE

The iaedp[™] Certification program will discontinue the Equivalency Route to Certification as of II:59pm on December 31, 2020. Applications submitted after this date will follow requirements for the Traditional Route.

<u>Equivalency Route</u> applications submitted prior to the deadline and that do not clearly meet Equivalency requirements will need to reapply under the requirements for <u>Traditional Route</u>.

The iaedp Certification program, as formalized in 2015, has been taking steps towards accreditation by achieving standards set forth by accrediting agencies. Examples of standards achieved include the following:

- psychometric evaluation of testing standards and test questions for the Certification Exam,
- proctoring for the online test,
- tightening of requirements on Traditional and Equivalency applications,
- strengthening policies and procedures that support certification, and
- both honoring and ending a period of certification for leaders/teachers in the field (Equivalency) that has now exceeded five years.

As part of ongoing standards, you will see more updates such as a Certification Handbook and a revision of the curriculum and Certification Exam.
